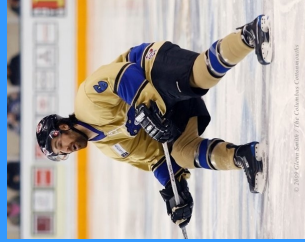


Management:

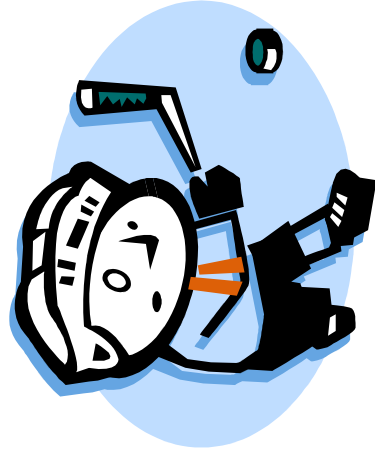

10th Annual Hockey Camp

The ICE WORLD HOCKEY CAMP has been developed to serve the needs of players from age 6 to 15. This camp is designed for players of all abilities and levels of experience. It will reinforce the fundamental aspects of skating, shooting, passing, and stick handling, which are necessary to play the game of ice hockey. In addition, this camp will provide a technical look at the way the game is played, and situations that may be presented within a game.

This five day camp will incorporate 3 hours of on-ice instruction and training per day, classroom seminars, dry land training and stretching. This school will also feature a written evaluation for each player, and each age group will be led by a Head Coach and two Assistants/Counselors responsible for supervision.

The philosophy of this camp is one which strives for the development of young players looking to advance their skills in ice hockey. We do this by

taking an approach to instruction which is backed by a combination of basic skills and positive reinforcement.

Each participant will be guided toward a stronger foundation of skating skills, stick handling and shooting skills, training techniques, and an understanding of how the game is played. At the ICE WORLD HOCKEY CAMP, we believe it is important for players to know the reasons behind the training techniques they will endure and how they will help to become a better hockey player.

During each week, we will feature a **special guest** who will speak about the commitment and mindset it takes to become a successful hockey player.
